On-Street Parking

Whether you're stopping to meet friends, picking up supplies, or buying tickets to an upcoming show, on-street parking is available for quick trips. If you plan to park for an extended period of time, consider a [garage](#) or [surface lot](#) and use [mobility options](#) to travel to and between destinations.

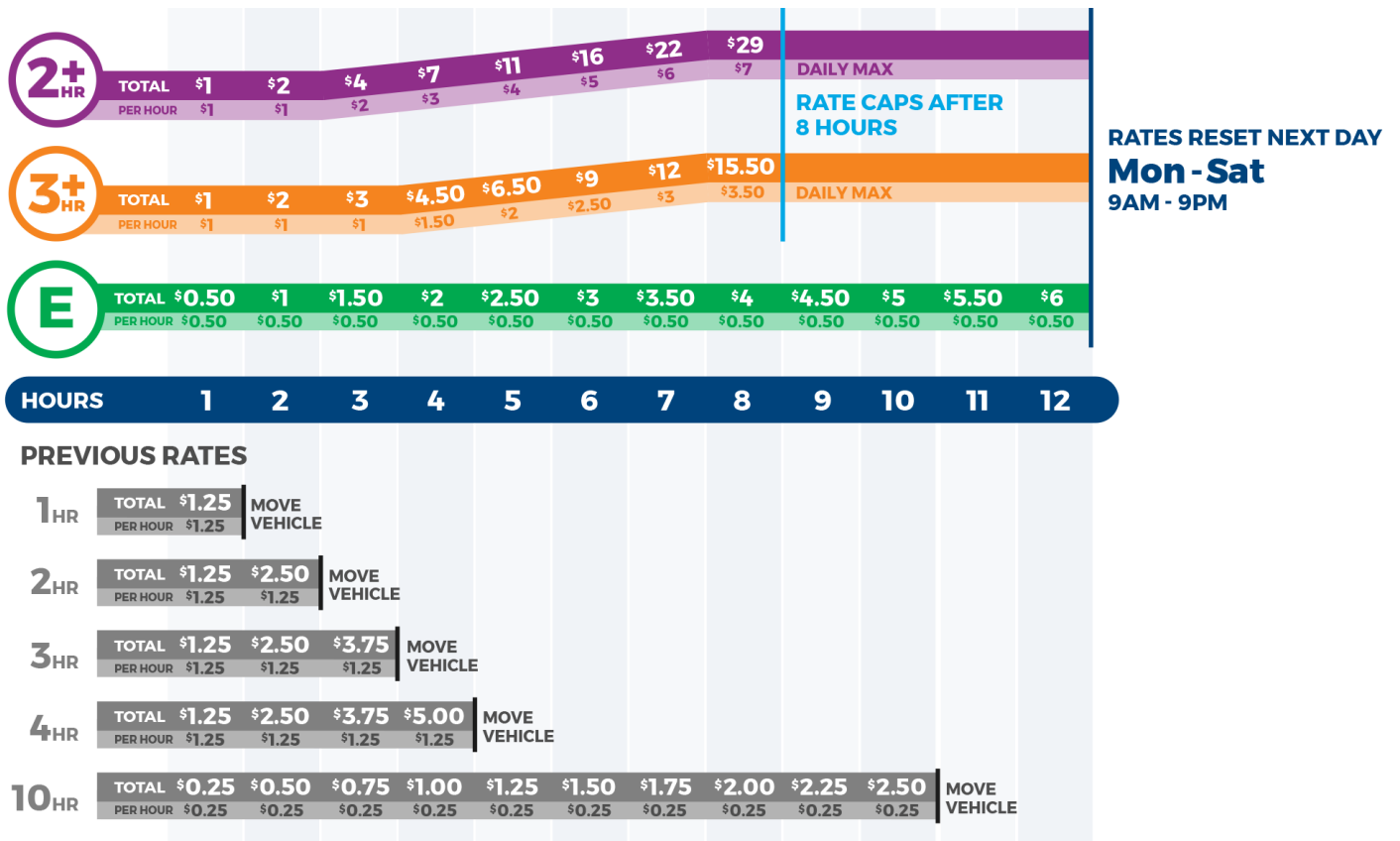
The City of Omaha operates [metered parking spots](#) on nearly every block in downtown and midtown Omaha. You can download the [Park Omaha app](#) or the [ParkMobile app](#), create an account and use it to pay for parking at any metered space in Omaha or text "PARK" to 77223 (accepts card payment). You can also "pay by plate" by entering your license plate information at a multi-space meter (which accepts coins or card payment). Signs will direct to the location of the nearest multi-space meter.

How On-Street Parking Rates Work

With typical parking meters, the hourly limit indicates when drivers will get a ticket if they don't move their vehicle. In a progressive parking rate system, hourly limits indicate when the rate will begin to increase —

meaning drivers don't need to move their vehicle, but they will start to pay more per hour to remain parked on the street. Drivers who want to stay in an area longer, whether they're employees, residents or visitors, still have ample parking opportunities in off-street [garages](#) and [surface lots](#), which have flat hourly rates.



Rate Zones

There are three rate zones in this new progressive rate structure.

- If a driver parks in a **purple "2+" area**, the parking rate will increase hourly beginning after two hours, with a max daily price of \$29. The base rate for this zone is \$1/hour for the first two hours.

- If a driver parks in an orange **“3+” area**, the parking rate will increase hourly beginning after three hours, with a max daily price of \$15.50. The base rate for this zone is \$1/hour for the first three hours.
- If a driver parks in a **green “E” area**, which means economy parking, the rate is \$0.50/hour. The rate will not increase and will have a max daily price of \$6. Occasionally, economy parking may have higher hourly rates when large events are happening nearby, but the rate will remain flat. Enforcement

Drivers are no longer ticketed for overstaying in a space by “feeding the meter,” but if they do not pay for their length of stay or do not pay at all for their space when parking, that still warrants a ticket, in addition to other safety violations.

Hours

Metered parking is enforced **MONDAY - SATURDAY, 9 A.M. TO 9 P.M.**, excluding Sundays and holidays.

Metered parking is not enforced on the following city holidays:

- New Year’s Day
- Martin Luther King Day
- President’s Day
- Memorial Day
- Juneteenth
- Independence Day
- Labor Day
- Columbus Day
- Veteran’s Day
- Thanksgiving Day
- Christmas Day

Meter holidays fall on the exact date of the holiday, rather than the observed day. For example, if New Year's Day falls on a Sunday but is observed on the following Monday, meters will be enforced on that Monday. Meters are active on Christmas Eve & New Year's Eve.
